# Market Garden (Required) – 4 hours per week

• Spend time working in the market garden maintaining plant beds, harvesting vegetables, and weeding. Assist with improving market garden space.

# 1. Livestock

Holistic planned grazing of livestock and poultry. Learn animal husbandry, fencing, rotational
grazing, animal management, budgeting, and storing/marketing products. Complete daily
livestock chores and be on call evenings/weekends in case of emergency. Work with livestock
team members to manage livestock and poultry rotationally grazing 300 acres.

# 2. Greenhouse

 Work in both aquaponic and traditional greenhouse spaces. Learn how to manage aquaponic systems, plant nursery, hydroponics, plant propagation, plant production, harvesting and packaging leafy greens and herbs, food safety, and marketing products. Emphasis on facility upkeep and maintaining cleanliness of greenhouse.

#### 3. Facilities Maintenance

 Work across the farm maintaining facilities and equipment. Learn basic maintenance and upkeep of buildings and equipment. Engage in special projects including mechanics and woodworking.
