Internship Tracks

Option 1: Experiential

In the experiential internship track, interns rotate to three different departments at Juneberry during the summer. Interns would spend approximately 3 weeks in 3 different focus areas described below.

Option 2: Immersive

The immersive internship track allows interns to spend more time in focus areas described below and engage on a deeper level. Students in the immersive internship will work in 2 focus areas spending 5 weeks in each area. During each 5-week rotation, interns will have a project to complete related to the focus area.

Internship Focus Areas

1. Livestock

- Holistic planned grazing of livestock and poultry. Learn animal husbandry, fencing, rotational grazing, animal management, budgeting, and storing/marketing products. Complete daily livestock chores and be on call evenings/weekends in case of emergency. Work with livestock team members to manage livestock and poultry rotationally grazing 430 acres.

2. Plant Production

- Work in aquaponic and traditional greenhouse spaces. Explore aquaponic systems, greenhouse in-soil production, growing in a plant nursery, hydroponics, plant propagation, harvesting leafy greens/herbs, and food safety. Emphasis on facility upkeep and maintaining cleanliness of greenhouse.
- Spend time working in the market garden maintaining plant beds, harvesting vegetables, and weeding. Assist with improving market garden space.

3. Facilities Maintenance

- Work across the farm maintaining facilities and equipment. Learn basic maintenance and upkeep of buildings and equipment. Engage in special projects including mechanics and woodworking.

4. Land Management

- Learn land management by working with the land team to maintain landscapes and trails, manage pests, and operate equipment. Emphasis on maintaining horticultural beds (weeding, planting, weed eating, and mowing).

5. Hospitality, Agritourism & Marketing

• 5A: Hospitality & Agritourism

- **Hospitality:** Gain knowledge on the hospitality side of agriculture through maintaining community connections and planning, organizing, facilitating, and executing events. This rotation includes culinary experience with Juneberry chefs. Weekend work required for farm stays & Juneberry JAMS Festival; comp days taken during the week.
- **Agritourism:** Work with the education foundation to develop programs and curriculum for children, high school students, and adults. Facilitate summer farm camp for grades 3 – 6, lead tours for summer camp groups, advertise upcoming programs, and experience nonprofit operations.

• 5B: Hospitality & Marketing

- **Hospitality:** View above description in 5A.
- **Marketing:** Work alongside the marketing team to develop strategic marketing plans, create educational content, design and establish JEF branded materials.
